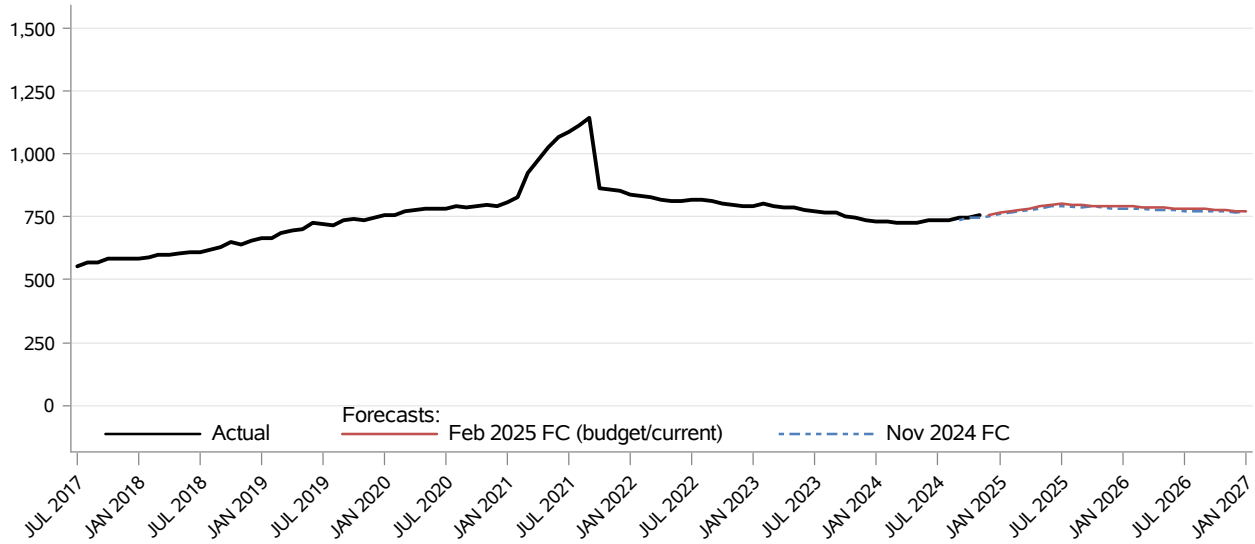


Children's Services Extended Foster Care

CFC Monthly Monitoring Report

The **Extended Foster Care** caseload is the unduplicated count of children receiving certain foster care benefits after turning 18 years old and graduating from high school. **Extended Foster Care** is intended to promote better outcomes for youth who have aged out of the traditional foster care system.
