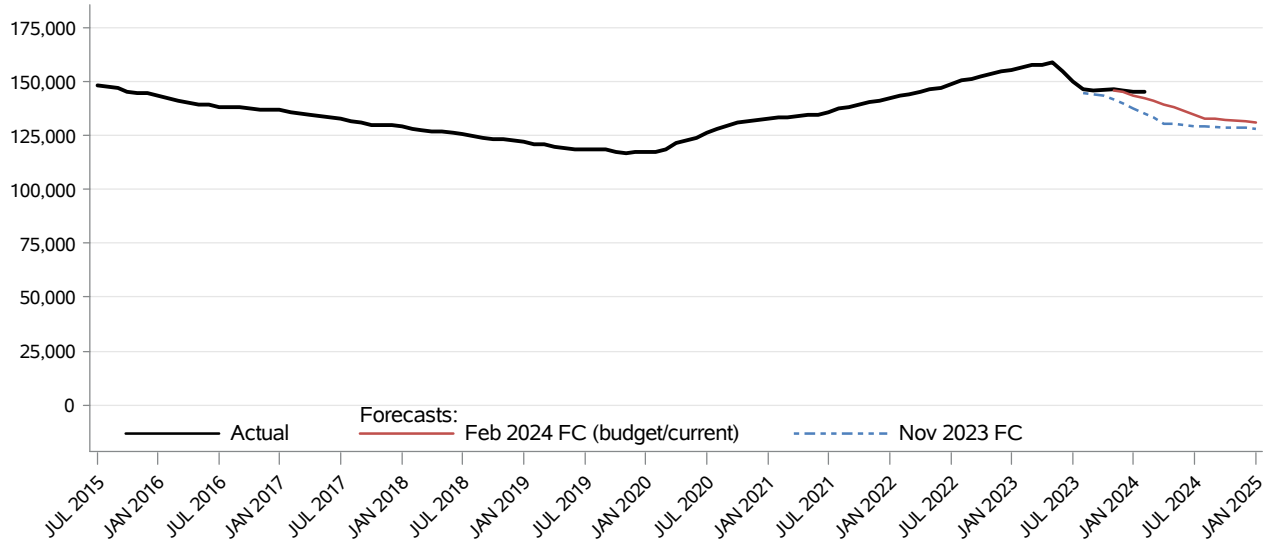


# Medical Services Adult Caretakers
